Welcome to the Fourth Annual Battle O' Baltimore!

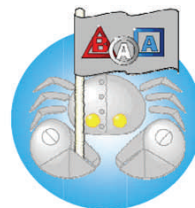
The FIRST Baltimore Area Alliance proudly presents the Battle O' Baltimore, the only off-season event in Maryland.

Honoring Mike Wade

The Baltimore Area Alliance dedicates the Battle O' Baltimore to the memory of Mike Wade.

Mike was instrumental in creating the Chesapeake Regional, supporting *FIRST* Robotics Competition teams, assisting off-season events and supervising the NASA mobile machine shop at regional FRC events across the country. He touched the lives of thousands of students and mentors in *FIRST*.

Mike produced the first Mid-Atlantic off-season FRC competition at the Maryland State Fair, and it was his wish to establish another in central Maryland. Many of the organizers of this event were trained by Mike, and worked with the FRC teams that Mike supported.

We hope that Mike would be proud of the way we are continuing his legacy of dedication to the students of Maryland.

What: Battle O’Baltimore

When: Saturday, August 7, 2010, 9 am to 6 pm

Where: Boys Latin School—Baltimore

Cost: FREE and open to the public

Sponsors: TIME Center; Community College of Baltimore County; and the FIRST Baltimore Area Alliance teams.

Founded by inventor Dean Kamen, FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) and its Robotics Competitions have swept the nation, engaging more than 32,000 high-school students in science and technology this year. FIRST helps high school students discover the rewarding world of innovation and engineering with the help of more than 18,000 volunteer mentors.

During the competition season, teams had 6 weeks to build 120 lb robots to play this year’s game called “Breakaway.”

The official competition events are held in March and April.

Off-season events are organized by local groups to provide additional competition opportunities and exposure to FIRST. The game is played based on the rules established during the regular season. The goal of off-season events is to train new members and entice the interest of potential participants.

In 2008-2009 there were more than 2,000 sponsors, and over \$9 million in college scholarships were awarded through FIRST.

FIRST competitions have been described as “the Super Bowl of Smarts.”

Teams at the Battle O’ Baltimore will be representing several states with many local teams participating.

This is the premier event in the Baltimore area for the off-season.

The Battle O’ Baltimore is an exciting event for all ages, including children.

HAVE FUN!!!!

Do respect everyone at the venue

Do bring banners/displays

Do operate in a safe manner

Do wear safety glasses in the pits and while competing

Do use tether cables to control your robot when not on the field

Do cheer for your team and show team spirit

Do cheer for other teams

Do decorate your pit area if you'd like

Do look at other robots in the pits

Do be prepared to show off your robot to visitors

Do be prepared to have younger roboteers and the public come to your pit and ask questions

DON'T

Don't run in the arena

Don't block aisles with toolboxes, carts, supplies, etc.

Don't boo other teams

Don't bang sticks or other noisemakers on bleachers

Don't bring flammable liquids into the arena

Don't have food in the pits or around the playing field

Don't sell food or other items

SAFETY ITEMS

- Safety Glasses for all team members and pit area guests
- Emergency contact numbers for all team members
- Simple First Aid kit supplies

ROBOT ITEMS

- Robot, tether cable, and all accessories needed
- Extra battery and charger for the robot
- A backup of your programs
- Laptop computer if necessary

PIT ITEMS

- Power strip and extension cords
- Tools needed for robot repair
- Extra parts needed for robot repair

TEAM ITEMS

- Gracious Professionalism
- Team Spirit
- Money for breakfast and lunch
- Notepaper and pens/pencils
- Team promotional handouts
- Camera
- Pit decorations if desired

If you arrive on Friday, please do not leave batteries charging overnight.
